




## ADVOCACY

MHA of Georgia makes and supports policy recommendations that promote the rights and access to care of individuals living with a behavioral health condition. We build solutions to increase access to health care all while combatting discrimination, and the stigma associated with mental illness.

#### The 2021 Legislative Session Included:

- Hosting a Freshman Forum to discuss mental health with our new legislators.
- Hiring a new Policy and Research Associate for tracking and reporting on legislation.
- Hosting our first virtual Mental Health Day at Capitol.
- Distributed over 18 Legislative Updates to more than 4K subscribers with a 20% average open rate.
- Presented Unified Vision for Mental Health Policy with the Georgia Mental Health Policy Partnership.







### YOUTH PROGRAMS

Our Kids On The Block program offers education and wellness puppetry arts performances for ages 3-12. Our LEAP programming has been extended this year to include youth and young adults up to age 26.

#### Program Highlights

The youth and young adults who participated in our program were provided various opportunities for personal and professional development. Examples of workshops include Time Management, Goal Setting, Networking, and Building Resilience. The program partnered with Mercer University to hold an informative workshop on how to build a resume and then participants could schedule time with a mentor directly to finalize their individual resume. We held a Mock Interview event where participants were partnered with a variety of professionals to practice and receive coaching on their interview techniques.

#### **Program Highlights**

We hosted 7 Behavioral Health Townhalls where we had 1,334 community members attend; Hosted 2 YMHFA train the trainers where we certified 28 new Youth Mental Health First Aid Instructors; We hosted an AMHFA train the trainers where we certified 12 new Adult Mental Health First Aid instructors. We hosted a teen Mental Health First Aid (tMHFA) train the trainers where we partnered with 6 different schools in the state of Georgia to certify 12 tMHFA Instructors. We hosted 5 trainings through our Professional Series, training 213 behavioral health providers.


